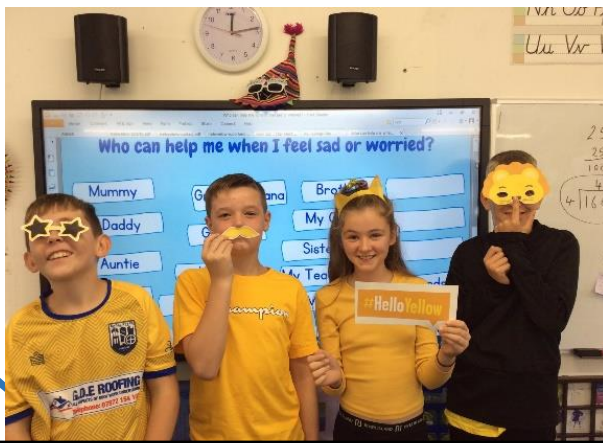
Hello Yellow Day for World Mental Health Day

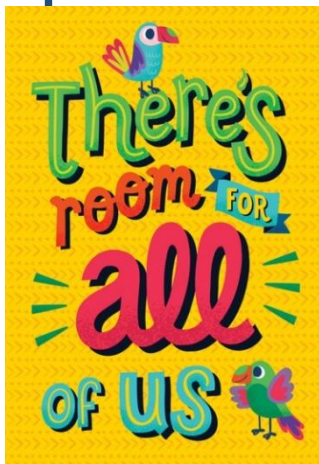


Harvest assembly – Year 5 Boyle
