The children then discussed how they could make somebody who felt lonely feel loved and how we can ensure that everybody in our school community can be involved in all we do.

Attendance matters: every day counts

Why is it important to attend school regularly?

School attendance is central to raising standards in education and ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential. Higher attendance in school leads to; giving children the best possible start in life; the ability to keep up with their work; they achieve better results; and they will develop further friendships and social skills.

Some key attendance facts: Attending 90% of the time or less will have a serious effect on learning; One day's absence every two weeks will give 90% attendance; Up to the age of 16, 90% attendance will mean losing over a year of school.
