We looked at some parables from the bible where being faithful was evident – we looked at both being faithful to what we believe and how we can be faithful friends to one anothers. We discussed the bibe story of King Saul



and how as friends we can play the part of either Jonathon or David and how we cann support one another. We then discussed faithfulness as the act of being honest in our actions and telling the truth. The children could offer great examples of how this would look in school and in our Friday assembly we heard some wonderful examples that had taken place over the week from children right across school who had shone like a star with faithfulness!

Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday, we celebrated Safer Internet Day in school. The focus this year was: 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online. Our computing lead, Mr Hughes, set up a range of resources for the children to use across school and to gain a wider understanding of how to be safe online. The children loved the different activities and games over the day, especially using the brand new iPads in school! Reception met 'Smartie the Penguin' who taught them to stop and think before clicking online, children in Year 1 and 2 used the magic pink headphones to be immersed in a now press play online safety course and our children across key stage 2 used the BBC live lessons on online safety and spent time looking at the impact of influencers and what not to share online.





My voice matters

We also celebrated Childrens' Mental Health week this week and shared our views on this years focus: My voice matters. The children had opportunities to discuss the importance of their voice and how it is their right for this to be listened to. We looked at how we can make this a reality at Wesley and the children were able to offer their views. We also looked at how we can have our voice heard with different groups of people from: parents, staff in school, other children and how we might approach this differently.
